



Almost all respondents (97%) have achieved improvements to their digital maturity over the last year.




90% of IT leaders see digital transformation as a priority for the next 3 months.




## DIGITAL STRATEGIES MAY STILL CONTAIN GAPS, BUT TECH LEADERS CONTINUE TO PURSUE DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION

Although it is a top priority for most, 58% of respondents feel there are still gaps in their strategy for achieving digital transformation.



Almost two-thirds (62%) of IT leaders see digital transformation as a way to achieve their current business goals, while the rest (38%) are allowing digital opportunities to redefine their business goals.





Cybersecurity (58%), increased flexibility/scalability (48%) and workflow efficiencies (41%) are the main goals for digital transformation.




Cloud computing (63%) and AI/ML (51%) are the top technologies IT leaders will be using to achieve their digital transformation goals.




## BUSINESSES ARE BEGINNING TO RECRUIT THE TALENT NECESSARY TO ACHIEVE DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION—AND CREATING NEW ROLES TO OVERSEE THE EFFORTS

Over a third (37%) of IT leaders report that their organization is recruiting executives with the specific skills needed to oversee successful digital transformation.




Over a quarter (28%) of IT leaders say their organization is creating new C-suite roles to oversee digital transformation efforts.




The majority of new roles being created to oversee digital transformation efforts are Chief Digital Officer (28%) and Chief Technology Officer (26%).
